CELEBRATING OUR FRIENDS IN HEAVEN AT SJB!!

Monday, OCTOBER 31st, 2022

The ancient English word for "holy one" or "saint" is "hallowed". All Saints' Day used to be called "All Hallowed Eve", and the modern term "Halloween" comes from this expression.

At SJB, we celebrate the eve of All Saints' Day as a festival of Saints. We are proud to have an army of friends praying for us in heaven, and we joyfully and visibly celebrate this good news by encouraging all students to dress up as a Saint for our All Saints' Day Parade. Prizes will be awarded to students in a variety of categories.

We also celebrate Grandparents' Day this day. Grandparents and other family members are invited onto campus to enjoy lunch with their Saints and to stay for the parade.

SAINT COSTUME GUIDELINES

- Dressing up as a Saint or a specific Angel such as Michael, Gabriel or Raphael is encouraged, but OPTIONAL (unless required by the teacher.) Students who do not dress up as a saint must come to school in full school uniform that day.
- 2. Boys must dress as male saints; girls must dress as female saints.
- 3. The costume must be recognized as a Saint's costume. Students can choose from any of the thousands of canonized or beatified Saints of the Catholic Church.
- 4. Students should be able to identify and say something about the Saint they represent.
- 5. Simplicity is encouraged. A Saint costume put together from things lying around the house is preferred to one purchased at a store or online.
- 6. Costumes should be comfortable for students to wear throughout the day, but jeans and a t-shirt that says "I am St. Mark" does not count as a costume.
- Costumes and accessories must be safe (ex: "sword" should be made of cardboard or other soft material and without a point).
- 8. "Bloody" costumes are permitted for the martyrs, but please use sensitivity and good judgment as to the amount of blood. The "blood" should be of a substance which dries and does not remain wet.
- The administration reserves the right to ask any student inappropriately dressed to change into their school uniform. If necessary, parents may need to come to school with the uniform.

When in doubt about any costume or part of a costume, ASK AHEAD OF TIME TO AVOID DISAPPOINTMENTS ON OCTOBER 31st!



FRIENDSHIP



WHAT IS IT?

A truly virtuous and holy friendship is one that wills the good of the other above all and encourages the practice of virtue and ultimately friendship with God.

WHAT DO THE SAINTS SAY?

Both Doctors of the Church, St. Basil and St. Gregory were influential Christian teachers of all time. St. Gregory here shares some memories of his friendship with Basil: "The same hope inspired us: the pursuit of learning. This is an ambition especially subject to envy. Yet between us there was no envy. We seemed to be two bodies with a single spirit. Our single object and ambition was virtue, and a life of hope in the blessings that are to come. We followed the guidance of God's law and spurred each other on to virtue. If it is not too boastful to say, we found in each other a standard and rule for discerning right from wrong."
