Counselors' Corner

As we go through the hustle and bustle of the season, many people are sitting in grief and trying to understand how to navigate a roller coaster of emotions. This is the most busy season of my private practice and one of the top reasons, is grief. As we all pray for families who are currently experiencing this, know that teaching our children how to cope with the sadness that comes with grief is incredibly difficult. So, here are a few tips I spoke about with the students to help them understand this particular journey and ways that parents can hold a safe space for them.

- 1. Let everyone have the freedom to process things at their pace. It doesn't have to be hurried, nor does everyone need to cry right away. It is ok to learn how to just accept the situation.
- 2. Don't project your own feelings on them. It is ok to be transparent with how you feel; however, others do not have to have the same feelings you have at the same time you do.
- 3. Let people experience the calm of the quiet despite its discomfort.
- 4. Anger is normal. It is to be expected, but with our children, the behavior manifested from anger is not to be excused. Give ourselves and our children alternative ways to process.
- 5. Lastly, sometimes words are not necessary. Do not feel like you have to verbalize anything. Many people simply want your presence.

VIRTUE OF THE MONTH OF DECEMBER:

PURITY



What Is It?

God calls us to have pure hearts, hearts that are totally for God and for love; hearts that are free from sin and selfishness. To have pure hearts, we must set our hearts totally on God and not let them become contaminated by the impurity of sin. Sometimes this means being countercultural in our choices of movies, music, and dress, because we do not want to allow anything sinful to enter our minds and hearts.

Saint Who Exemplified Purity

St. Maria Goretti is known as a martyr because she chose to die rather than commit a sin against purity and then she forgave her attacker.

How Do I Put It Into Practice?

- **Be confident!** Someone who is confident in God's love does not need to do what is wrong in order to seek the approval of others. Never lower your standards, but surround yourself with friends who seek purity, and glorify God in all you say and do.
- **Avoid Laziness.** Another huge opening for the devil of impurity is the capital sin of sloth or laziness. Idleness (laziness) is the workshop of the devil.
- Turn to the most pure and Immaculate Heart of Mary and beg for purity of mind, heart, body, soul and even intention. Ask her for the grace to live out the Beatitude that Jesus taught us: "Blessed are the pure of heart for they will see God." (Mt. 5:8)
